
Reception Newsletter - Term 6

This term we will be exploring a desert island as we begin on a pirate adventure. In literacy, we will be writing our own pirate themed sentences, and we will retell the familiar pirate stories through role-play.

In maths we are developing our subilising skills, and we are embedding our knowledge σ_f number bonds to 10. We are challenging ourselves to write number sentences also.

Across the curriculum, we will be digging for treasure in our very own island, and will be creating maps for others to follow, and we will be on guard protecting our loot.

Through this topic we will learn about other countries, the ocean, vehicles, maps, and the history of pirates.
